Continuing Education Credit

- Continuing Education Units (CEU)
- Registrants will receive continuing education units and credit for all modules and plenaries they attend during the meeting.
- Continuing Education Unit (CEU) is a nationally recognized measure
 of participation in a continuing education program. A CEU is defined
 as ten hours of program contact (1 CEU = 10 hours of education
 programming). In countries, such as Canada, the term Continuing
 Education Credit (CEC) is used instead.
- Certified Research Administrators (CRA)
- RACC accepts credit for all modules and plenaries that you attend during the meeting. One contact hour is equal to one credit hour (1 hour 15 minute sessions = 1.25 hours; 1 hour 30 minute session = 1.5 hours)
