





The push for open access is finally reaching a tipping point

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Hey, you know what would be a tangible societal benefit? Making all the research behind your paywalls open access.



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I have an idea: how about making all the research on mental health open access so mental health professionals not attached to a university with an expensive subscription can access the latest research?

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That's rich from a company plagiarizing researchers' words to fuel its own AI bot. Maybe if the pressure to publish wasn't so high (a situation that clearly benefits commercial publishers like yourself) then researchers wouldn't feel so forced into taking short-cuts?

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Taylor & Francis Group, **Springer Nature in India**, **MDPI** and probably many other publishers already offer discounts for authors from low- to middle-income countries and sometimes waive fees entirely, so exactly how is this "an industry first?"

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
